The concentration of our recombinant proteins is measured using the absorbance at 280nm. The protein's absorbance will be measured in several dilutions and is measured against its specific reference buffer.

The concentration of the protein is calculated using its specific absorption coefficient. We use the ExPASy's ProtParam tool to determine the absorption coefficient of each protein.

Purification:	Three step purification of membrane proteins expressed in baculovirus infected SF9 insect cells:  <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Membrane proteins are fractionated by ultracentrifugation and subsequently solubilized with different detergents (detergent screen). Samples are analyzed by Western blot.</li><li>2. The best performing detergent is used for solubilization and the proteins are purified via their rho1D4 tag via two rho1D4 antibody columns: one DTT resistant, the other one not. Eluate fractions are analyzed by Western blot.</li><li>3. Protein containing fractions of the best purification are subjected to second purification step through size exclusion chromatography. Eluate fractions are analyzed by SDS-PAGE and Western blot.</li></ol>

Background:	Mitochondrial membrane ATP synthase (F <sub>1</sub> F <sub>0</sub> ) ATP synthase or Complex V) produces ATP from ADP in the presence of a proton gradient across the membrane which is generated by electron transport complexes of the respiratory chain. F-type ATPases consist of two structural domains, F <sub>1</sub> - containing the extramembraneous catalytic core and F <sub>0</sub> - containing the

	membrane proton channel, linked together by a central stalk and a peripheral stalk. During catalysis, ATP synthesis in the catalytic domain of F(1) is coupled via a rotary mechanism of the central stalk subunits to proton translocation. Part of the complex F(0) domain.
