Background:	Synonyms: TF-1 cell apoptosis-related gene 19, Programmed cell death protein 5, TF-1 cell apoptosis-related protein 19, Protein TFAR19, PDCD5. Background: This gene encodes a protein expressed in tumor cells during apoptosis independent of the apoptosis-inducing stimuli. Prior to apoptosis induction, this gene product is distributed in both the nucleus and cytoplasm. Once apoptosis is induced, the level of this protein increases and by relocation from the cytoplasm, it accumulates in the nucleus. Although its exact function is not defined, this protein is thought to play an early and universal role in apoptosis.
